# The Dean's Message



#### Greetings!

I am honored to be writing my first message as one of your Co-Deans. I'd like to take this opportunity to share some information about the wonderful year of events that we have ahead of us in the District of Columbia Chapter.

October marks the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Protestant Reformation, and we are marking this event by holding our Installation of Officers in the Sanctuary of the Lutheran Church of the Reformation on East Capitol Street on the evening of Monday, September 18<sup>th</sup>. We are delighted that Reformation's Director of Music and Arts, Paul Leavitt, together with his choir, will be joining us for the event, which we are hosting together with the Potomac Chapter. Paul is an accomplished composer, and we are looking forward to hearing about his experiences in the Lutheran Church as it moves towards this significant day.

In October and November we have two AGO events held in the exquisitely beautiful setting of the Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land in America with its Lively-Fulcher organ. On Sunday, October 15<sup>th</sup>, we are joining with NOVA Chapter and Potomac Chapters in presenting Princeton University Organist, Eric Plutz in the Pipes Spectacular annual celebrity recital, and on Monday, November 6th, Sub-Dean Jeremy Filsell and the choir of the Church of Epiphany will lead us in a program of Morales at the Monastery, featuring works by Cristóbal de Morales, perhaps the most influential Spanish composer before the more famous Tomás Luis da Victoria. We could hardly have a more perfect setting for this music.

In the first days of January 2018 (date to be announced), we are once again invited to join the Potomac Chapter for its annual Twelfth Night celebration, and on Monday, February 19<sup>th</sup> we are





## Music @ the Monastery

Located on 42 acres, the Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land is a beautiful architectural gem hidden in the northeast corner of Washington, D.C. Dedicated in 1898, the church is in the shape of a Jerusalem Cross in neo-Byzantine architectural style. The church and extensive contemplative gardens include full-size replicas of shrines from the Holy Land (the Franciscans have ministered there for 800 years), plus catacombs and a Lourdes Grotto. The monastery also has two hermitages for personal retreats. The Monastery's Lively-Fulcher pipe organ was built in 1998 and contains forty ranks of pipes over three manuals and pedal.

Together with the Franciscan Monastery, the DC AGO is proud to support a series of community outreach musical events titled, "Music @ the Monastery". These events are free of charge and take place on the second Sunday of each month at 4pm, followed by a reception. All are welcome!
