

Jametta was organist at St. Luke's Episcopal Church (1514 15th Street NW Washington, DC) for over 35 years, from 1969-2005.





# Welcome to our new board members!

*Jan-Piet Knijff*, a pianist, organist, harpsichordist, conductor, occasional singer, vocal and instrumental coach, writer, and language teacher.

Jan-Piet is based at the Middleburg Academy in Middleburg, VA, where he teaches Latin and music. He also continues to teach music and languages privately, both on site and via Skype, with Latin students as far as the American Midwest and the Australian New England.

Jan-Piet was previously based in Vermont, where he conducted the Northeast Kingdom Community Orchestra and Lyndon State Community Chorus as Adjunct Professor at Lyndon State College and served as Organist/Choir Director of the Barton United Church, a community that will always be close to his heart. During June and July, Jan-Piet continued the 90 installments of his *Jan-Piet's Choice* in Armidale, Australia with eight *Choices* at Montpelier's Christ Church, this time playing and discussing organ music from Sweelinck to Reger.

Joy-Leilani Garbutt, is the Minister of Music at Christ Lutheran Church in Washington, D.C. She also serves as the organist for the Takoma Park Seventh-day Adventist Church, and choral accompanist for the Spencerville Seventh-day Adventist Church.

Joy-Leilani is pursuing a Ph.D. in musicology, a minor in sacred music, and organ studies with Dr. Jeremy Filsell at the Benjamin T. Rome School of Music at The Catholic University of America. Her research interests are focused on early 20th-century French organ music by female composers, particularly Joséphine Boulay, Mel Bonis, Nadia Boulanger, Lili Boulanger, and Jeanne Demessieux.

She holds a Master of Education degree from The Harvard Graduate School of Education and a Master of Music in organ performance from Northwestern University. As an organist and harpsichordist she performed with the New England Youth Ensemble in England, South Africa, New Zealand, Australia, and Mexico.

# Music @ the Monastery

Located on forty-four acres of beautifully landscaped gardens, the Franciscan Monastery (Mount St. Sepulchre Franciscan Monastery) is a beautiful architectural gem hidden in the northeast corner of Washington, D.C. Built in 1899 in the shape of a Jerusalem Cross in neo-Byzantine architectural style, the Monastery includes gardens, replicas of various shrines throughout Israel, a replica of the catacombs in Rome, an archive, a library, as well as bones of Saint Benignus of Armagh, brought from the Roman Catacombs and originally in the Cathedral of Narni, Italy. The Monastery's Lively-Fulcher pipe organ was built in 1998 and contains forty ranks of pipes over three manuals and pedal.

Together with the Franciscan Monastery, the DC AGO is proud to support a series of community outreach musical events titled, "Music @ the Monastery". These events are free of charge and take place on the second Sunday of each month at 4pm, followed by a reception. All are welcome!
