

From The Potomac Organ Institute

Dear Colleagues,

The *Potomac Organ Institute* was founded in 1988 to interest pianists in the field of church music by providing instruction on the pipe organ. Auditions for prospective students are held annually and successful applicants receive one year of free organ instruction from a volunteer Tri-Chapter Guild member with lessons from September through May. Students participate in a master class, a spring recital, become members of their local AGO chapter, and receive a complimentary subscription to The American Organist magazine.

I am writing to ask you to identify a student or students – grades 7 and up, as well as adults – who have a good piano background, are interested in learning to play the organ, and who would benefit from a year of organ instruction.

Auditions will be held on Friday evening, June 23, and again on Saturday morning, June 24, at St. Columba's Episcopal Church, 4201 Albemarle Street, NW, Washington, DC. For information, including a downloadable audition form and list of requirements, please go to our website, www.potomacorganinst.org. A flyer is also attached to this email.

Over the years we have discovered that these beginning organists make remarkable progress during this time of free instruction. Many continue organ lessons after their scholarship year and some even go on to study organ and/or church music in college.

I am grateful for any assistance you can provide in identifying students – young people and adults – for this unique program. The number of awards available is limited, so those with an interest in this opportunity are encouraged to read details on the website and submit an application by June 9, 2017. 

Music @ the Monastery

Located on forty-four acres of beautifully landscaped gardens, the Franciscan Monastery (Mount St. Sepulchre Franciscan Monastery) is a beautiful architectural gem hidden in the northeast corner of Washington, D.C. Built in 1899 in the shape of a Jerusalem Cross in neo-Byzantine architectural style, the Monastery includes gardens, replicas of various shrines throughout Israel, a replica of the catacombs in Rome, an archive, a library, as well as bones of Saint Benignus of Armagh, brought from the Roman Catacombs and originally in the Cathedral of Narni, Italy. The Monastery's Lively-Fulcher pipe organ was built in 1998 and contains forty ranks of pipes over three manuals and pedal.

Together with the Franciscan Monastery, the DC AGO is proud to support a series of community outreach musical events titled, "Music @ the Monastery". These events are free of charge and take place on the second Sunday of each month at 4pm, followed by a reception. All are welcome!
