

I have a two-rank organ for sale. It was built by Wicks Organ Company, completed in the factory in 1990 and installed in my house in Falls Church, Virginia in January 1991.

Specifications:

Manual I 4' Gemshorn 58 pipes (50% tin)

Manual II 8' Gedeckt 58 pipes (cherry)

Couplers (operated by hitchdowns) Manual II to Manual I Manual I to Pedal Manual II to Pedal

Mechanical key action with aluminum trackers. There is no stop action as the stops are permanently on. There is no expressive enclosure. The organ is completely encased in a beautiful dark-stained cherry case. Manual naturals are ebony with maple accidentals. The organ is 6'0" wide, 5'4.5" deep (including pedalboard, 5'8" including bench) and 7'10" high.

I also have a 16' Quintade of 61 pipes for sale. These pipes are from the 1969 Moller formerly in Christ Episcopal Church in Georgetown, Washington, DC. 1-13 are zinc; 14-61 are spotted metal. Included are the gates for 1-12. D# in the fourth octave has a dent in the foot, but the speech is not affected.

I also have organ magazines I do not plan to take with me, but would hate to throw away. Please let me know if you might be interested in any or all of the following:

The Diapason (I have been a continuous subscriber for over 50 years and have copies of all since then.

The American Organist and Music Magazine (many issues throughout the years)
