

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




Did You Know?

Did you know that the National City Christian Organ has two sets of chimes, two zimbelsterns and a set of hand bells?

Did you know that January 8, 2017 marked the 40th anniversary of the death of Garnell Stuart Copeland, organist and choirmaster at the Church of The Epiphany 1968-1977? Copeland was just 34 when he died just after midnight in an ambulance after being attacked by three assailants on the steps of his Capitol Hill home on January 6th 1977. The following year the congregation of Epiphany dedicated in Copeland's name the horizontal rank of 49 trompette-en-chamade pipes in the rear south gallery, an addition to the Aeolian-Skinner organ Copeland had helped design in 1968. With the addition of the new stop, Epiphany became the first parish church in the United States with two such ranks, one in each end of the building. A second memorial to Copeland is a stained-glass window incorporating the notation of a motif from a hymn he wrote.



Music @ the Monastery

Located on forty-four acres of beautifully landscaped gardens, the Franciscan Monastery (Mount St. Sepulchre Franciscan Monastery) is a beautiful architectural gem hidden in the northeast corner of Washington, D.C. Built in 1899 in the shape of a Jerusalem Cross in neo-Byzantine architectural style, the Monastery includes gardens, replicas of various shrines throughout Israel, a replica of the catacombs in Rome, an archive, a library, as well as bones of Saint Benignus of Armagh, brought from the Roman Catacombs and originally in the Cathedral of Narni, Italy. The Monastery's Lively-Fulcher pipe organ was built in 1998 and contains forty ranks of pipes over three manuals and pedal.

Together with the Franciscan Monastery, the DC AGO is proud to support a series of community outreach musical events titled, "Music @ the Monastery". These events are free of charge and take place on the second Sunday of each month at 4pm, followed by a reception. All are welcome!
